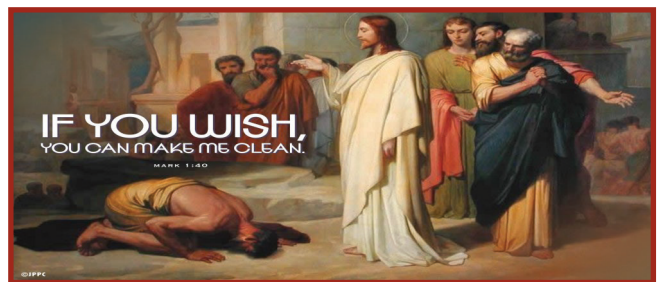

Dear Parishioner,

Today's Gospel invites us to think about the choices we make as individuals and as a family. Jesus was faced with a choice in today's Gospel. By choosing to heal the man with leprosy, Jesus showed God's compassion for the sick and the outcast. The man knew that Jesus had a choice and that Jesus could reject his request. He may have expected that Jesus would not help him. The social taboos regarding leprosy certainly gave him little on which to base his hope. In the person of the man with leprosy, we see an image of all those in need. The sick and the outcast of our world are watching us, to see if we as Christians will choose to extend ourselves to others in need of healing and compassion. How fitting to read the message of today's Gospel as we celebrate St. Valentine's Day, the patron saint of lovers!

Today is also the last Sunday before the Liturgical Season of Lent begins. We will tuck away our "alleluias" until the great feast of Easter. Based on the Hebrew word, hallelu yah, meaning "Praise the Lord" alleluia is a word of great praise to God in the life. Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice. The Gospel Acclamation is now replaced with the words "Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless Glory! The Gloria (Glory to God) is also suspended until we gather on the beginning of the Triduum as we celebrate the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday which will officially mark the beginning of our Lenten journey. As many things have dramatically changed in the way we live our lives and the way we celebrate our liturgies over the course of this last year, the same will hold true as to how we gather and celebrate Ash Wednesday. We are accustomed to receiving the sign of the cross on our foreheads marked by ashes as we hear the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return". This year the ashes will be sprinkled on top of our heads, yes this is because of the pandemic but there is a long history of this practice and is the customary practice at the Vatican and in Italy. In fact the ashes sprinkled on top of our heads and not on our foreheads is certainly more aligned in the message from the Gospel which will be proclaimed on Ash Wednesday. *When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites.*

They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting.

Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you. (Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18)

Sunday Readings

Reading I : [Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46](#)
Those who are sick shall live outside the camp.

- The Book of Leviticus is a collection laws; many having to do with the proper worship of God.
- In today's reading we hear of illness and exclusion from communal life.
- Because people did not know about the process of contagion at the time, the community banished persons with any skin disease as long as the disease lasted.

Reading II: [1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1](#)
Imitate me as I do Christ.

- The passage from 1 Corinthians refers to a concern the early Christians had about eating meat that had been sacrificed to idols.
- Paul makes the point that our behavior toward others is more important than what we eat or drink.
- Paul's advice is to avoid offending one another at all costs.

Gospel: [Mark 1:40-45](#)
If you will do so, you can cure me.

- The Gospel story shows that Jesus not only has the power to cure disease, he also has the power to heal the separation from the community and the separation from God, which leprosy signified.
- Jesus' approach to the leper would have scandalized the people of his time.

Family Reflection Corner

Weekly Readings Reflection

Choose one of the following activities as a way to further reflect on the Sunday readings.

- Make a coupon for each member of your family. Draw a heart on each coupon. In the heart, draw a picture of something you will do for them to bring Jesus' healing touch.
- Jesus wants us all to be whole and healthy. What part of your life would you like Jesus to touch and heal?
- Ask your child to tell you about people he or she knows who may feel left out. Plan with your child ways he or she can reach out to this person. Be sure to demonstrate to your child the love and support and confidence you have in him or her. Share with your child his or her success in reaching out to others. Let your child know that you are proud of him or her.

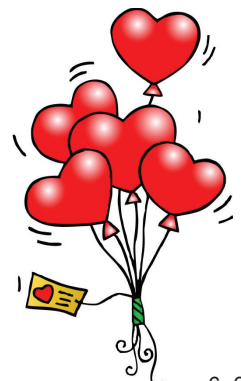
Register for the COVID-19 Vaccine

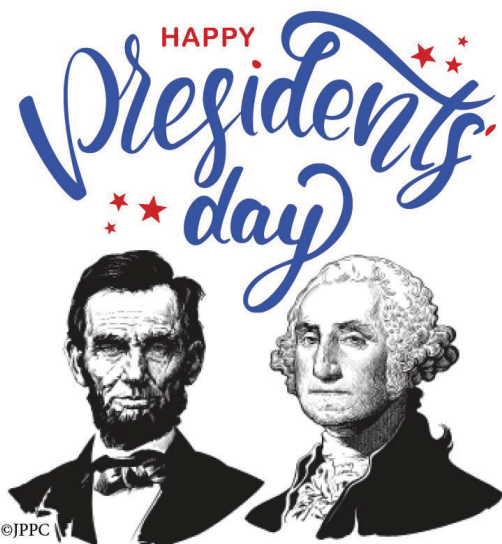

PREPARE: 10 ITEMS FOR LENT (6-10)

6. **Don't do too much.** It's tempting to make Lent some ambitious period of personal reinvention, but it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That's a recipe for failure.
7. **Lent reminds us of our weakness.** Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them. When we fast, we realize we're all just one meal away from hunger. In both cases, Lent shows us our weakness. This can be painful, but recognizing how helpless we are makes us seek God's help with renewed urgency and sincerity.
8. **Be patient with yourself.** When we're confronted with our own weakness during Lent, the temptation is to get angry and frustrated. "What a bad person I am!" But that's the wrong lesson. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.
9. **Reach out in charity.** As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is almsgiving. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection plate; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.
10. **Learn to love like Christ.** Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.
