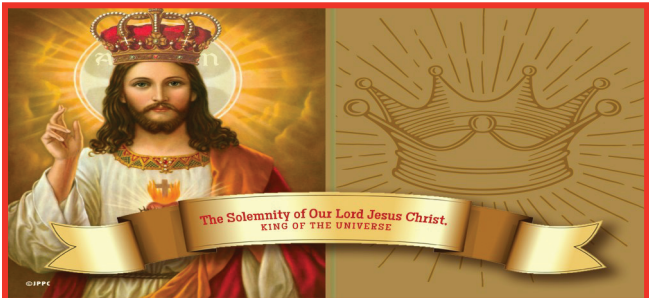

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Peace be with you, with your whole family and more than ever with the world!

Prayer leads us to Evangelize and Evangelization leads us to SERVE THE POOR. All three must be integrated in the church and in our daily lives. We have focused on prayer and Evangelization today let us look at our service to the poor.

Jesus came and taught us that if we integrate all three then our lives will be richer bringing us happiness and joy. Jesus was born in the lowliest town of all of Galilee, Nazareth. This is what two disciples said about Nazareth when Jesus called them. **Reading I :** [Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17](#)

*I will tend my sheep.*

- In ancient times, the king was often called the shepherd of his people.
- In today's first reading, the prophet Ezekiel contrasts the wicked shepherds, who exploit the flock and neglect the weak, with God, who gives rest to the flock.

**Reading II :** [1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28](#)

*Christ has been raised from the dead.*

- In Paul's description of the Resurrection, Christ was the King, the shepherd, who laid down his life for the flock.

**Gospel :** [Matthew 25:31-46](#)

*When did we see you hungry?*

- Today's discourse on the end time in Matthew is a description of the final judgment under the figure of a king-shepherd who separates the good and bad animals in his flock. The bad are identified as goats and the good as sheep.
- The goats and sheep represent "all the nations," all peoples who had been called together for this judgment.

## Liturgy Corner...learn something new or maybe even become inspired !

### Reflections on *Mysterium Fidei* by Pope Paul VI

#### Sections 56-63

The worship of latria is the next focus for the Holy Father, Paul VI. Latria is the highest act of worship and is reserved for God alone. Paul VI points us to display this latria, both during and outside of Mass, towards the Eucharist as we have already discussed that the Eucharist is Jesus Christ, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity. The Eucharist deserves the highest respect possible, and this has been the tradition since the earliest days of the Church. The Fathers of the Church, such as Origen, mentions the abuse of dropping particles of the Most Blessed sacrament on the floor (MF 58). The other abuse would be to “preserve: the sacrament after receiving it from the priest at Mass. The other major abuse is the idea that the Eucharist, after the liturgy, cannot give sanctifying grace if distributed another day. St. Cyril of Alexandria, however, condemns this idea by saying, “the power and force and life-giving grace of the blessing remain in [the Eucharist] forever” (MF 60). Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. The great reverence we show the Eucharist, as St. Paul VI notes, developed into more feasts (such as Corpus Christi) and devotions, which will be discussed next week.

The overall purpose of this encyclical, if we recall, was to clarify the teachings of the Holy Eucharist. Part of this teaching is if the Eucharist is Jesus Christ, then it is fitting to give the Eucharist the utmost respect of worship, latria. How often do we pass the tabernacle without genuflecting, or making a profound bow for those who are unable to genuflect, or forget that Christ is present in the monstrance? On the altar? Christ is the Eucharist. How beautiful it is that we are the only faith that can drive 10 minutes to a Church and stand before and converse with our Creator, Redeemer, and our Sanctifier!

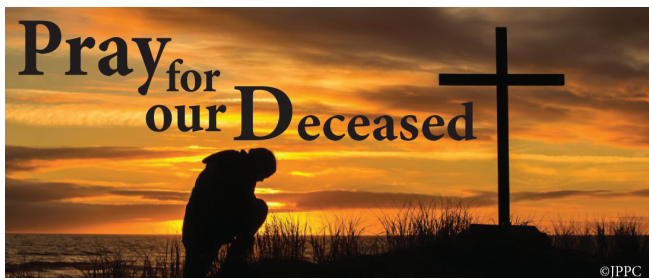

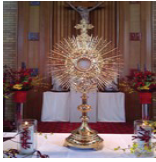


## Prayer Opportunities
